Portfolio objectives & investment policy

The Portfolio aims to provide capital growth over the medium to long-term by investing in a diversified range of assets and markets worldwide. The Portfolio is actively managed investing in funds across the sustainability spectrum including ESG integrated, screened, sustainability themed and impact strategies. Assets can invest in a range of investment vehicles such as collective investment schemes, closed ended investment schemes, real estate investment trusts and exchange traded funds which themselves invest worldwide in any of the following: 1. equity or equity related securities; 2. fixed income securities (including government bonds and corporate bonds); 3. currencies; and 4. alternative assets. Alternative assets may include funds that use absolute return strategies or funds that invest indirectly in real estate and commodities. The portfolio is part of the Schroder Sustainable Portfolio range, which offers six model portfolios with different expected combinations of investment risk and return. This portfolio is risk level 4, which aims to be the second lowest risk portfolio in this range with the second lowest equity weighting. Please note, the risk level of this portfolio has a target average annual volatility (a measure of how much the portfolio's returns may vary over a year) over a rolling five year period of between 40% to 55% of that of global stock markets (represented by the MSCI All Country World index). However, it is important to note that volatility is only one measure of risk.

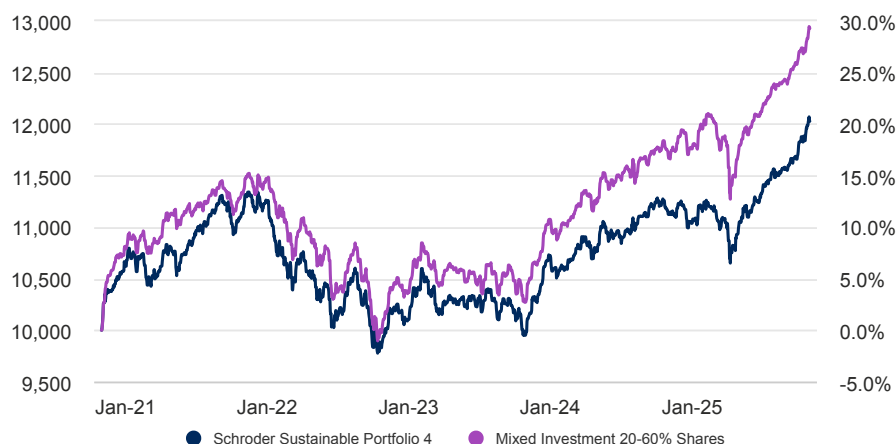

Risk considerations

Performance risk: Investment objectives express an intended result but there is no guarantee that such a result will be achieved. Depending on market conditions and the macro economic environment, investment objectives may become more difficult to achieve.

Interest rate risk: The portfolios may lose value as a direct result of interest rate changes.

Equity Risk: Equity prices fluctuate daily, based on many factors including general, economic, industry or company news.

Derivatives Risk: Derivatives, which are financial instruments deriving their value from an underlying asset, may be used to manage the portfolio efficiently. The portfolio may also materially invest in derivatives including using short selling and leverage techniques with the aim of making a return. A derivative may not perform as expected, may create losses greater than the cost of the derivative and may result in losses to the fund.

Counterparty Risk: The portfolios may have contractual agreements with counterparties. If a counterparty is unable to fulfil their obligations, the sum that they owe to the portfolios may be lost in part or in whole.

Sustainable investing risk: The portfolio applies sustainability criteria in its selection of investments. This investment focus may limit the portfolio's exposure to companies, industries or sectors and the fund may forego investment opportunities that do not align with its sustainability criteria chosen by the investment manager. As investors may differ in their views of what constitutes sustainability, the fund may invest in companies that do not reflect the beliefs or values of any particular investor.
