### Fund objectives and investment policy

The fund aims to provide capital growth in excess of the Standard & Poor's 500 (Net TR) Index after fees have been deducted over a three to five year period by investing in equities of large-sized US companies.

The fund has environmental and/or social characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 on Sustainability-related Disclosures in the Financial Services Sector (the "SFDR").

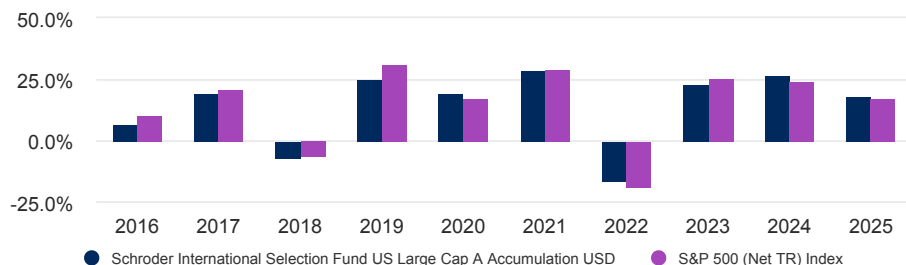

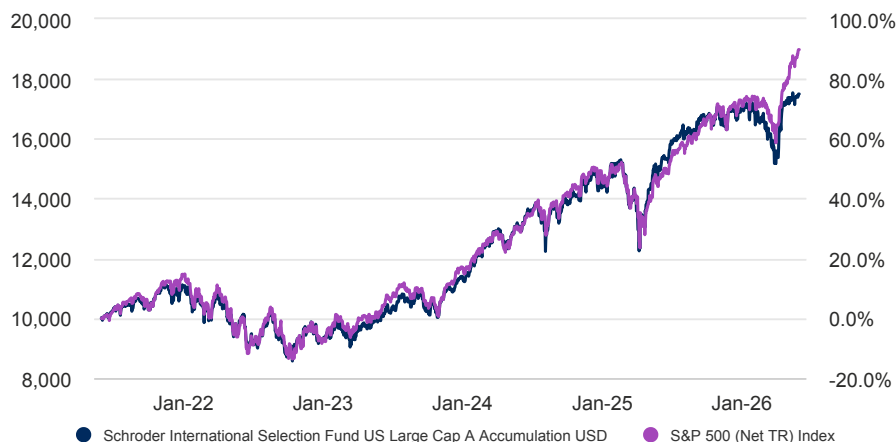

### Risk considerations

**Concentration risk:** The fund may be concentrated in a limited number of geographical regions, industry sectors, markets and/or individual positions. This may result in large changes in the value of the fund, both up or down.

**Counterparty risk:** The fund may have contractual agreements with counterparties. If a counterparty is unable to fulfil their obligations, the sum that they owe to the fund may be lost in part or in whole.

**Currency risk:** If the fund's investments are denominated in currencies different to the fund's base currency, the fund may lose value as a result of movements in foreign exchange rates, otherwise known as currency rates. If the investor holds a share class in a different currency to the base currency of the fund, investors may be exposed to losses as a result of movements in currency rates.

**Derivatives risk:** Derivatives, which are financial instruments deriving their value from an underlying asset, may be used to manage the portfolio efficiently. A derivative may not perform as expected, may create losses greater than the cost of the derivative and may result in losses to the fund.

**Liquidity risk:** In difficult market conditions, the fund may not be able to sell a security for full value or at all. This could affect performance and could cause the fund to defer or suspend redemptions of its shares, meaning investors may not be able to have immediate access to their holdings.

**Market risk:** The value of investments can go up and down and an investor may not get back the amount initially invested.

**Operational risk:** Operational processes, including those related to the safekeeping of assets, may fail. This may result in losses to the fund.

**Performance risk:** Investment objectives express an intended result but there is no guarantee that such a result will be achieved. Depending on market conditions and the macro economic environment, investment objectives may become more difficult to achieve.

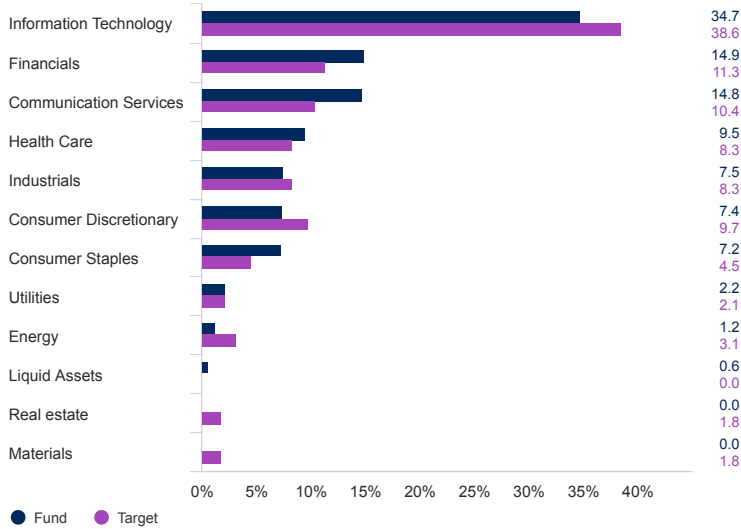
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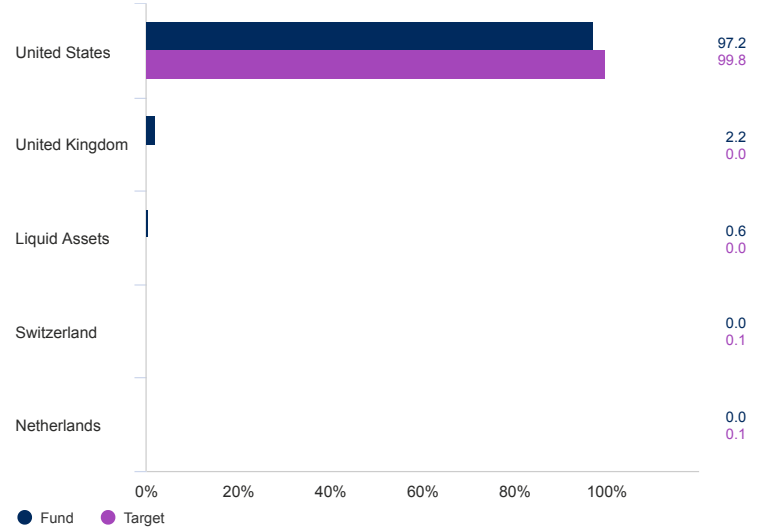
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### Asset allocation

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#### Objective/Investment Policy Changes

On 04 May 2026 the fund objective was updated.

#### Name Changes

On 20 August 2001 the fund changed its name from Schroder ISF US Equity to Schroder ISF North American Equity.

On 15 May 2006 the fund changed its name from Schroder ISF North American Equity to Schroder ISF US Large Cap.

#### Benchmark/Comparator Changes

On 30 November 2011 the target benchmark changed from S&P 500 (Composite) Lagged to S&P 500 Net TR Lagged. The full track record of previous benchmark was removed and replaced with the new one.

On 04 May 2026 the target benchmark changed from S&P 500 Net TR Lagged to S&P 500 (Net TR) Index. The full track record of the previous index has been kept and chain linked to the new one.

#### Benchmarks: (If applicable)

Some performance differences between the fund and the benchmark may arise because the fund performance is calculated at a different valuation point from the benchmark. The target benchmark has been selected because it is representative of the type of investments in which the fund is likely to invest, and it is, therefore, an appropriate target in relation to the return that the fund aims to provide. The investment manager invests on a discretionary basis and there are no restrictions on the extent to which the fund's portfolio and performance may deviate from the benchmark. The investment manager will invest in companies or sectors not included in the benchmark in order to take advantage of specific investment opportunities.
